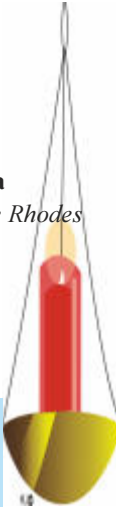

### WHY DO WE DO THAT?

#### Question:

How can we pray for the dead throughout the year?

#### Answer:

We commemorate the faithful departed on November 2nd each year. However, we can and should continue to pray for the dead. Our growth in Christian perfection takes a long time. At the time of our death, many of us might not be saints yet. But God, in His mercy, allows for those who love Him to experience purification after death. Our word for that state is Purgatory. It's the antechamber of heaven, so to speak. We know we're getting in the house, but we're not quite ready to go all the way in. There's rain to shake off our coats and dirt that's clogging our shoes.

Here on earth, we can pray for the souls in Purgatory. One way is to request that your parish offer a Mass for the intention of a specific loved one. We can also remember the departed in our daily prayers. Just as we have special intentions for family and friends here on earth, we can pray for those who have died. It's also a good act of Christian charity to pray for the forgotten, those who have no one else to pray for them. God knows who they are!

### GOSPEL MEDITATION

#### ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Christ loves us first. So much of the Christian life is as simple as that. Today's Gospel is a prime example! "Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man ... was seeking to see who Jesus was." We may have gotten used to the story of Zacchaeus, this short, seemingly innocent man who climbs a sycamore tree in his desperate desire to see Jesus. But this colorful, children's Bible illustration isn't what the gathering crowd would have seen. They would have seen the white collar criminal. Tax collectors were notorious for extortion. They were collaborators with the oppressive Roman overlords, overcharging for taxes and skimming a cut off the top. And how does Jesus respond to this man?

"Come down quickly," Jesus says, "for today I must stay at your house." If you had been there, would you have believed it? No doubt there were other disciples in the city or, at the very least, kind, generous, and just people. "Good" people. But those aren't the people Jesus chooses to share a meal with. Christ loves us first. He chooses Zacchaeus even before the man makes a public profession of his repentance.

"The Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost." We may not be tax collectors and extortionists — I hope not! — but we all have elements of our lives that are lost. We have wounds from childhood, unresolved anxieties or attachments, daily fears. No matter how "put together" we are, we all have our lost moments. Some days, it may feel like we can't see over the ways they crowd our inner life. Today's Gospel invites us to do something a little strange. Don't let your flaws, failures, or hang-ups prevent you from seeing Jesus. Take a deep breath. Go climb a tree, because Jesus is passing by. And he wants to stay in your heart today.

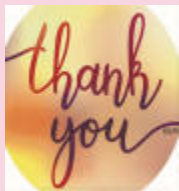

## Catholic Schools Week

Dear Friends in Christ,

During the week of November 3-9, we are celebrating "Discover Today's Catholic Schools in New England" Week. Catholic Schools Week, now entering its 46<sup>th</sup> year, is an annual celebration nationally. It is a week in which schools schedule activities and events that provide opportunities for celebration and engagement with students, families, parishioners, and community members. Visitors are able to see firsthand the benefits of the way our students learn, communicate, pray, and live out their faith each and every day. It is also a time to reflect on the value and importance that Catholic education has on our communities locally and globally.

The New England diocesan Superintendents requested permission from the National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA) to change the dates to November of the activities associated with the National Catholic Schools Week normally in January. Due to the unpredictability of the weather in New England, oftentimes it was necessary to cancel or postpone activities and events celebrating our schools. The Superintendents were granted permission last year, and will be continuing that change this year. They were delightfully surprised to hear recently that NCEA is also adding a November week for the national celebration as well. The January week will still be honored for Open House and optional activities internally, but our main celebration will be in November, when our part of the country is arrayed in God's splendor of the beautiful weather and colors of Autumn.

It is truly a time to celebrate how our Catholic virtues, values, and social justice involvement contribute to productive citizenship and responsible leadership. Our schools are safe environments which encourage prayer and are welcoming and supportive of children and teenagers. ***Our high school graduation and college attendance rates are outstanding.*** The commitment of our school employees and administrators to the ministry of Catholic education is to be highly commended. We are blessed to have such supportive pastors, deacons, and religious sisters and brothers in our schools who serve as true witnesses of those who dedicate their lives to service in the Lord.

## Archdiocese for the Military Services (AMS) *"Serve Those Who Serve"*

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Next week November 9-10, 2019, the triennial collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, U.S.A. will be taken up at all Masses. The Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS) was established by Saint John Paul II in 1985 to provide the Catholic Church's full range of pastoral ministries to those in the United States Armed Forces. The mission of the Archdiocese is to "*serve those who serve*" by providing the same pastoral care and services as any other Catholic diocese to Catholics serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled in U.S. Military Academies, undergoing treatment at any of the 153 Department of Veterans Affairs' Medical Centers in the U.S., Puerto Rico and Guam, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders, and the families of these populations.

**The AMS is the *only* source of Catholic chaplains for the U.S. military and Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers.** All told, the AMS and its endorsed priests and deacons are responsible for pastoral service to approximately 1.8 million Catholics.

While the salaries and retirement of military and VA chaplains are paid for by the government, the AMS receives no funding from the military or the government in support of programs and services vital to the mission and ministry of the AMS, including *Vocations, Evangelization and Catechesis, Sacramental Records, Tribunal and Veterans Affairs*.

Unlike a conventional diocese, the AMS has no parishes or parish registries. The AMS has no weekly collections, and therefore relies solely on the generosity of private donations to support its aforementioned programs and services. The Office of Sacramental Records currently maintains over 3 million records as the AMS maintains all records of sacraments celebrated on U.S. Military Installations and at VA Medical Centers since 1920 at the Edwin Cardinal O'Brien Pastoral Center in Washington, D.C.

Pope Francis has told military ordinaries from around the world that "The role of military chaplains is to accompany and support [those in need] on the journey, to be a comforting and brotherly presence for them all." (Pope Francis, Address to participants in the 8<sup>th</sup> Humanitarian Course, 26.X.15.) ***Your support of the National Collection for the AMS will bring the Gospel, the sacraments and other forms of spiritual support to men and women who serve our Country and defend our freedoms, including parishioners and families from our own diocese.***
