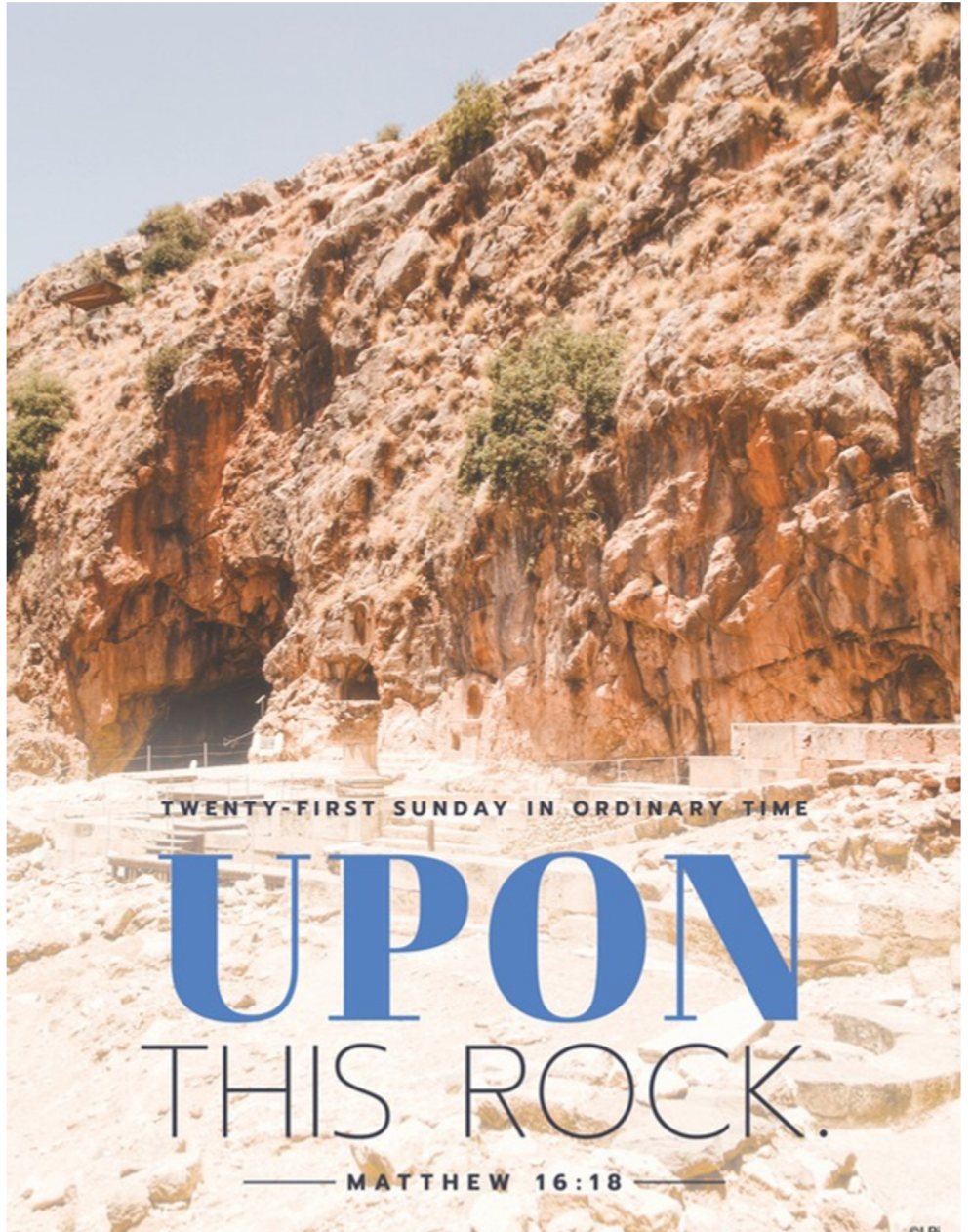
Matrimony:

DON'T GET SCAMMED!! The latest email scam going around is a "special event invitation" email that appears to come from someone you know—even another parishioner! Do not click on the links in the email! Always Pause, Think, and Look for red flags – Has this person ever sent you an evite before? Or any kind of invitation? Does the email have any actual details (date, time, place, reason for event)? If you're still questioning its validity, confirm the invite with the person who "sent" it, using a different method – phone, direct email, or in person. And remember this, too: Fr. Joe does **NOT** email, so anything claiming to be from him is a SCAM. Please just delete these!

We have completed several projects with funds from the Capital Campaign.

- Insulated the crawlspace in the rectory
 - Replaced wooden columns with steel in rectory basement
 - Replaced Sanctuary and Narthex roofs
 - Repaired Sanctuary Dormers
 - Replaced older furnace and A/C unit in rectory
- We are beginning the update of the church heating system to improve efficiency and reviewing options for replacement of the hall carpet. All of this is made possible through your generosity and faith!
