
## SUSTAINING OUR LEGACY

#### From the Pastor

#### **Dear Christ the King Parish Family,**

In November 2025, the parish of Christ the King will celebrate the 20th anniversary of our church complex at 1 McCurdy Road. Our parish leaders and volunteers spent years planning, designing, and creating the facility that we now call home, and since we moved in we



have celebrated Mass every day (even during Covid!); rejoiced in baptisms and weddings; found comfort at funerals; educated our young people through Faith Formation classes; gathered together for dinners and special events; and reveled in the camaraderie of events like the annual Harvest Festival.

But two decades of constant use has taken its toll on the bricks-and-mortar of our church complex, and there are a number of urgent repairs needed, as well as long-term maintenance that will ensure the future of our church home. For this reason, Christ the King parish is embarking on a \$750,000 capital campaign, *Sustaining*

significantly so that our facility can accommodate our parish family for many years to come, and allow us to continue to celebrate in this space we have created.

There were Catholics in Old Lyme for many years before Christ the King Parish was established in 1934. Going to Mass in those days meant taking a ferry across the Connecticut River (or walking across the train bridge when the river was frozen!). It wasn't until the early twentieth century that the faithful were able to attend Mass in their own church here in Old Lyme. Thanks to summer visitors to Soundview, Our Lady of Good Counsel Chapel was built in 1906, but with no heat that building was unsuitable for year-round use. In 1934 the newly formed Christ the King parish moved into the former Baptist church on Main (Lyme) Street, and that structure remained our home for over 70 years, until we outgrew that space and built the present complex at 1 McCurdy Road.

As we look ahead to our parish centennial in 2034, we must take steps now to preserve, sustain, and maintain



what we have built. Please read on to learn more about what we will accomplish through the *Sustaining our Legacy* campaign, and then prayerfully consider how you and your family can support this effort as stewards of our parish.

Rev. Joseph Ashe Pastor **In 2025,** the Catholic Church marks a Jubilee Year of grace and reconciliation. This focus on spiritual renewal also gives us an opportunity to renew our commitment to our faith through stewardship to our local parish through our time, talent, and treasure.

I have been fortunate over the years to be involved in many aspects of ministry to the faithful at Christ the King: through our exceptional music ministry as a cantor and member of the choir, through administration as an ACA chair and parish council member, and through participation in the Men's Club, Zoom Ministry, and facilities committee.

We are marking the 20-year anniversary of our move to our current parish facility and rectory. The wear and tear of those 20 years is evident on the buildings and grounds, and our 2025 capital campaign *Sustaining Our Legacy: Nurturing our Community of Faith* seeks to raise funds to address these facility issues and plan for future facility needs:

#### SANCTUARY AND PARISH COMPLEX

- · Exterior paint and trim work
- · Replace roof and repair leaks
- Replace flooring in church hall
- Upgrade heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) systems to reduce energy costs
- Replace fluorescent lights with LED lighting to lower energy costs
- Refinish Sanctuary floors
- Upgrade outdated computers and office equipment

#### **RECTORY**

Christ the King is blessed to have two wonderful priests in residence. To continue to support their ministry here, upgrades to the 200-year-old church rectory are also required:

- Exterior paint and carpentry work
- · Site grading work and foundation repair
- HVAC upgrades and water heater replacement
- · Chimney sealing and re-flashing
- · Low pitch roof replacement
- · Basement insulation and sealing
- Interior painting
- Replacement windows
- Planning for future structural repairs

We have many talented volunteers who offer their time and talent to help maintain our buildings and

grounds. We are unfortunately at a point where deferred maintenance can no longer be postponed, and more extensive work is needed to refresh and restore the facilities.

Each of us has something to offer the parish through our stewardship, and I am asking you to consider how you might participate in the current need with your financial support. A successful campaign will allow us to continue to minister to the needs of the faithful in Old Lyme and the larger shoreline community, and
