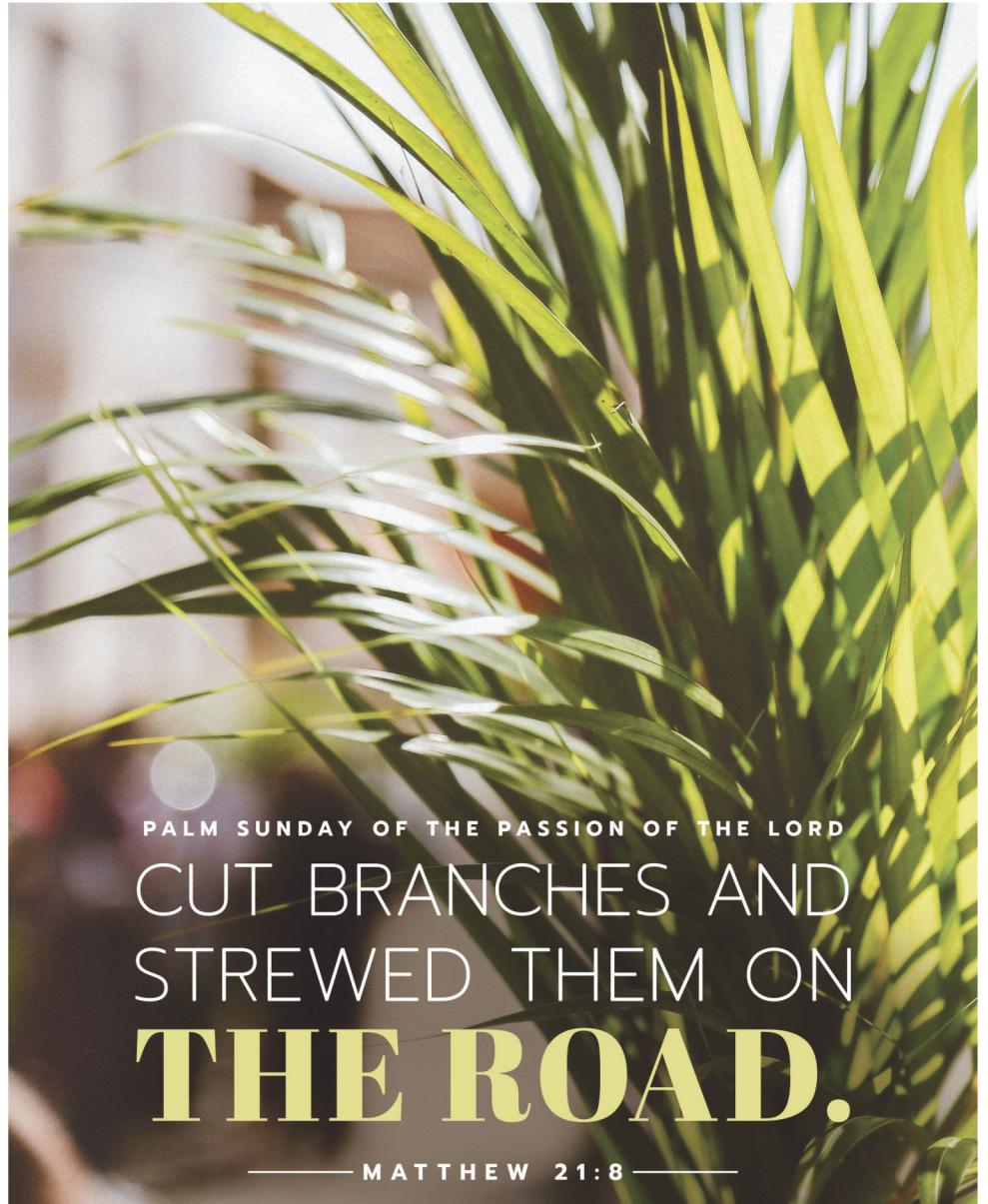

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

“As they were marching out, they came upon a man of Cyrene, Simon by name; this man they pressed into service to carry his cross.” Matthew 27:32

The Lord calls us to love God and to love our neighbor. Every day we are presented with opportunities to love our neighbor and help him “carry his cross.” These opportunities aren’t usually big events; they are usually ordinary occurrences like helping someone carry their groceries or holding the door open for them. The key is putting the other person’s needs before our own and not expecting anything in return.

Stewardship Corner

At Christ the King Church, beginning with the new Liturgical Year, Second/Special Collections will be combined with our primary collection during the Offertory each week. We will be providing information about the timing and purpose of each collection as it approaches, in the Weekly Bulletin (refer to the “Stewardship Corner”) and pre-Mass announcements, as well as on our parish website.

In addition to the Sunday envelopes (for parishioners using the envelopes for giving), there are “extra” envelopes provided which do not necessarily coincide with a planned Second/Special Collection. These often relate to an observance during the liturgical year which may or may not fall on a Sunday. This year, His Excellency, Bishop Richard F. Reidy, Bishop of Norwich, invites you to the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral of Saint Patrick in Norwich on Tuesday, March 31, 2026, at 10:30 a.m.

The Chrism Mass is the Liturgy during which the sacred Chrism is consecrated and the Oil of the Sick and the Oil of the Catechumens are blessed.

The Sacred Chrism, oil mixed with sweet perfume, symbolizes the presence of the Holy Spirit. It will be used in the parishes of the Diocese of Norwich in the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. It is also used at the Ordination of Bishops and Priests and at the Dedication of a Church and altar.

The Oil of the Sick is used to anoint those who are suffering from illness so that they may receive strength and healing, both physical and spiritual.

The catechumens will be anointed with the Oil of Catechumens in preparation for their Baptism at the Easter Vigil.

The Chrism Mass is a celebration of the entire local Church, and the subsequent use of the oils in the various parishes is a sign of unity among God's people. Since the Chrism Mass is truly a Diocesan event ALL parishioners are invited.
